The Freedom of Information Law ("FOIL") office received your above-referenced request on 4/15/2016. You requested a copy of the number of driver's licenses that have been suspended for non-driving related drug offenses under NY CLS Veh & Tr for the past 3 fiscal or calendar years for which we have data available; number of these driver's licenses that have been reinstated following the expiration of the suspension period and receipt of the reinstatement fee; the number of people who have been arrested for driving without a license after having their license suspended for a drug conviction; and the current fee to reinstate a driver's license suspended for a non-driving related drug offense in NYS.

FOIL requests are normally granted or denied within twenty (20) business days from the date of this acknowledgement letter. Dear Ms. Walsh:

The FOIL Office received your above referenced request on April 15, 2016. On May 31, 2016, you sent an amended request for the number of driver's licenses that have been suspended for non-driving drug related offenses during 2014 and 2015. You also requested the current fee to reinstate the driver's license after such a suspension.

Our records show there were 21,714 suspensions for Possession and/or Sale of Drugs in 2014 and 17,697 in 2015.

Enclosed is a copy of our form P-71D 'Information for Motorists Who Have Received an Order of Suspension (Form MV-510D) for a Drug-Related Conviction'. The form is available on our website (dmv.ny.gov) along with other information regarding suspensions/revocations of driver's licenses. The suspension reinstatement fee of \$50 (fifty) is explained in the last paragraph.

We hope the information being provided will be of assistance to you.

We believe we have fully complied with your request for DMV records. However, Public Officers Law §89 provides that any person denied access to a record may appeal such denial in writing within THIRTY (30) days of the date of denial. We have enclosed a FOIL Appeal Form which can be completed if you feel you have been unjustly denied access to records.

# INFORMATION FOR MOTORISTS WHO HAVE RECEIVED AN ORDER OF SUSPENSION (FORM MV-510D) FOR A DRUG-RELATED CONVICTION

Your driver license/permit or privilege to drive in New York State (NYS) is suspended because you were convicted of a misdemeanor or felony under Articles 220 and 221 of the Penal Law.

If your driver license is issued by another state you do not have to turn it in, even though your privilege to drive in NYS is suspended. You must not resume driving in NYS until you complete your period of suspension. You may then contact a motor vehicle office to request restoration. You must not resume driving in NYS until your driving privilege has been restored.

If your license/permit or driving privilege is already suspended or revoked at the time you are sentenced, you must complete that suspension or revocation period before your 6-month suspension for the drug offense will begin. If you have served any time in custody related to this offense, you are entitled to receive credit for the time served. Bring proof of time served to the motor vehicle office when you apply to have your full license/permit or driving privilege restored.

DMV will notify you by mail if you are eligible for a restricted use license/permit or privilege to drive during the suspension period.

If you are eligible for a restricted use license or privilege to drive, bring your application to a motor vehicle office after you receive your notice of eligibility. Please do not go to the motor vehicle office to apply before you receive the eligibility notice.

You must turn in your NYS photo license/permit to a motor vehicle office before you will be issued a restricted use license, if you did not already turn in your license/permit to the court (or if you turned in a temporary license). If the court gave you Part I of form MV-510D, "Continuation of Driving Privileges", you must turn that form in to the motor vehicle office when you apply for a restricted use license. There is a \$75 administrative fee that you must pay to DMV when you apply for a restricted use license, and a \$12.50 photo document fee, in addition to any other applicable licensing fees.

In addition to serving the suspension period, you must pay a suspension termination fee before your full license/permit or privilege can be restored. This fee is \$50 if the effective date of the suspension is on or after July 6, 2009. This fee can be paid by cash, credit card, certified check, money order or personal check (clients who are restricted to paying with "certified funds" may not pay by personal check). A credit card payment cannot be made by mail; payment of the suspension termination fee by credit card (Master Card, Visa, American Express, or Discover) can be made only at a motor vehicle office or online at the DMV website: dmv.ny.gov/pay-suspension-termination-fee.
